

In the Matter of the Application of Bennett Burnard to become a citizen of the United States:

Monroe Co Court, held at Rochester on the 14th day of August 1868. Present, the Honorable Jerome Fuller Judge.

I Bennett Burnard of the City of Rochester in said County, do declare, on oath, that I was born in the Palau as I am informed and believe, on the 3rd day of July in the year 1845; and that I emigrated therefrom and arrived in the United States on or about the 15th day of July in the year 1847, and that it is my bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State and Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the Empire of Russia

Rochester in the County of Monroe in the State aforesaid,

having been duly sworn, depose and say, each for himself that they are citizens of the United States, that they are well acquainted with Bennett Burnard that he has resided in the United States for five years last past, and not elsewhere, and for the last year in the State of New-York, and during all that time has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same.

I, Bennett Burnard do solemnly swear, that I will support the Constitution of the United States, and that I hereby entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign prince, potentate, state and sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the Empire of Russia of whom I am a subject. So help me God.

The said applicant having made application to this Court to become a citizen of the United States, and it appearing to the full satisfaction of this Court that the said applicant has resided in the United States for at least five years immediately preceding this application, and for the last year in the State of New-York, and that he has in all respects complied with the laws of the United States in relation to naturalization; and the said Court being satisfied that during all that time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; and the said applicant having appeared in open Court, and taken and subscribed the oath that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and of abjuration required by law: ORDERED, that the said Bennett Burnard be and he is hereby admitted a citizen of the United States, and of any of them.
